Fun with Flip Books

During the study of the five themes of geography, use a flip book to help reinf the concepts.

Materials:

Three 41/4" x 11" (11 cm x 28 cm) colorful paper strips

Markers or colorful pencils

Magazines

Stapler

Scissors

Glue

Directions*:

- 1. Line up the three pieces of paper so that the bottom of each sheet extends 3/4" (2 cm) beyond the sheet above it.
- 2. While holding the three pieces of paper together, fold them so that the top of the first sheet is 3/4" (2 cm) from the bottom of the first sheet.
- 3. Staple the top of the flip book.
- 4. Label the top flap (the cover) "The Five Themes of Geography."
- 5. On the next five flaps, label each with one of the themes: Location, Place, Human/Environment Interaction, Movement, and Regions.
- 6. Then, write the definition of each theme underneath the previous flap.
- 7. Draw or use pictures cut from magazines to illustrate each theme.
