STUDENT SERVICES

Autistic Support - Itinerant and inter-district classroom programs for students PreK-21; designed to teach students with autism the skills to be successful and increase independence.

Center-Based Academies - Providing academic, therapeutic, and behavioral health services beyond the public school settings. The goal is to provide students with coping and academic skills while supporting families in transitioning back to a traditional educational setting.

COTA Service Provision & OTR - Occupational therapy services provided by certified occupational therapy assistants for students PreK-21 years old with fine motor, visual motor, perceptual motor, and/or sensory impairments.

Educational Interpreter - Effectively communicates classroom information between the teacher, the deaf student, and other hearing students according to the language level of the student and the goals of the Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

Education Leading to Employment and Career Training (ELECT) - A free initiative to help pregnant and parenting teens earn a diploma or a GED, become better parents, and transition to employment, career training, or higher education.

ESL Instruction - Itinerant ESL teacher works with English Language Learners (ELLs), or those students for whom English is not their primary language. Our ESL teacher works with ELLs to help them acquire fluency in English, both spoken and written word.

Explore/ Job Coaching Services- Provides students with supervision and assistance while completing a variety of work-based learning experiences that allow them to develop into independent, well-skilled employees who are prepared to join the workforce.

Hearing Support - Itinerant service provision for eligible students PreK-21 years old who are deaf and/or hard of hearing providing the opportunity and environment in which they can develop communication skills to maximize their potential.

Life Skills Support - Program provides learning opportunities to students needing functional academic and independent living skills. Curriculum aligned to PA Core Standards and modified to meet student needs.

Multi-Disability Support - Program provides students with learning experiences and services to have each student achieve their potential as contributing members

of their community. The curriculum used is aligned with the PA Core Standards and adapted to meet student needs.

Orientation & Mobility - Assists the visually impaired student to develop an understanding of his/her own body and position in space. Students learn to gather and use information about the environment, community resources, and transportation systems.

Partial Hospitalization Program K-12 - Program serves students who need intensive short-term treatment to address acute psychiatric difficulties. The program is designed to prevent inpatient psychiatric hospitalization or re-hospitalizations and to help the student transition back to their life in the community.

Physical Therapy - Itinerant service provided by contracted physical therapists/ physical therapy assistants. Physical therapy in an educational setting is provided to help students maximally benefit from their established educational program and focus and develop functional skills and motor competence in educationally related activities.

School-Based Social Work – Districts may request contracted social work support for children and families to foster social, emotional, and academic growth.

School Psychology Services - Our psychologists work within contracted school districts, early intervention, and non-public schools to complete comprehensive evaluations to determine eligibility for special education services, as well as giftedness.

Special Education Coordinator Meeting - Monthly meetings for local, state, and/or national updates in the field of special education, as well as round-table discussion, networking, and planning for local special education needs across Bradford, Lycoming, Sullivan, and Tioga counties.

Special Education Supervision - Certified special education supervisors provide oversight of special education programs and services within contracted school districts to ensure compliance with special education regulations.

Speech/Language Therapy - Itinerant and school-based therapy provided by certified speech/language therapists. Services can include comprehensive assessment and meaningful educational support services for students.

Vision Support - Teachers of the visually impaired provide educational support services to those whose impairment, documented by an eye care specialist, adversely affects his/her academic performance.

EDUCATIONAL PLANNING SERVICES

Accelerated Learning - Statewide response to the instructional challenges and learning concerns during the pandemic. Focus areas include system conditions, academics, scaffolded supports, and supportive learning environments.

Act 45 Opportunities - Administrative courses that are PDE approved and support administrators in continuing and meeting professional education requirements.

Career Readiness - College, career, and community readiness planning, as well as guidance in Act 158 pathways.

Curriculum Coordinator/Contracted Services - Districts may request contracted, customized curriculum coordination services based on their needs.

Curriculum Council - Monthly meetings to discuss curriculum updates and PDE initiatives.

Curriculum Audits, Resource Mapping, and Writing - On-site curriculum development with alignment to PA Core standards and eligible content as a contracted service.

eQUIP - Provides school students, teachers, and administrators with personalized, engaging, and meaningful online learning opportunities.

FBA - Conduct comprehensive Functional Behavioral Assessments and provide consultative services for students with behavior concerns.

Innovation Lending Library - A collection of instructional equipment and technology available to school districts at no cost.

Instructional Coaching & Teacher Leadership - An instructional coaching mentorship program that is personalized to meet district coaching/leadership needs and supports coaching and teacher leadership in the classroom.

Paraprofessional Opportunities - Professional learning opportunities specific and customized to meet the needs of paraprofessionals.

Poverty Simulation - Professional Development in which participants role-play low-income families to gain a better understanding of poverty through an experiential setting.

Principal Cohort - Regional meetings focused on featured topics and networking for Building Principals and Aspiring Principals. Participants will also have the opportunity to participate in our "Principles of Practice" series as part of the cohort.

QBS - Safety care training in student de-escalation strategies and physical management.

School Counselor PLO - A Professional Learning Opportunity for topics will reference ASCA recognized materials, PDE initiatives, local community efforts, and district needs.

School Support & Improvement - On-site needs assessments and goal setting related to the eighteen essential practices.

STEM/Instructional Technology - Support with the integration of computer science principles and/or instructional technology. 2023-2024 efforts align with participants making the intentional shift to the new Science, Technology & Engineering, and Environmental Literacy and Sustainability (STEEL) Standards.

Student Assistance Program (SAP) - Coordinated training and networking with single county authorities and mental health and substance abuse treatment services.

Trauma-Informed / Restorative Practices - Collaboratives and offerings to support and focus on Trauma-Informed care for students, educators, and the community.

TAC – Assistive Technology - Training and consultation available for districts to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of children with disabilities through technology.

TAC - Autism - Training and consultation available for districts to assist building level teams to provide an effective educational program for students.

TAC – Behavior - Variety of services that are designed to meet the behavioral needs of students.

TAC – Inclusive Practices/LRE - Provides training in inclusive instructional practices.

TAC – Interagency Coordination/Transition - Assisting collaboration between districts, agencies, and families in educational placement.

TAC – Literacy - Training and consultation to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of children with disabilities through literacy.

TAC – Mathematics - Using the structure of Guided Math to support teachers and districts in strengthening Tier 1 instruction for mathematics.

TAC – MTSS/ RTII - Three-tiered framework providing students with high quality instruction and interventions in the areas of behavior, literacy, and mathematics.

TAC - P2G - Reducing the risk factors associated with school dropout. Trauma-Informed / Restorative Practices - Introductory training to trauma-informed and/or restorative practices and using circles effectively to foster a positive learning environment and school culture.
